PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

- Celebrate Christ's resurrection every Sunday (or Saturday evening) and on holy days of obligation by taking part in Mass and avoiding unnecessary work.
- 2. Lead a sacramental life; to receive Holy Communion frequently and the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year (annual confession is obligatory only if serious sin is involved); minimally also, to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.
- 3. Study Catholic teaching throughout life, especially in preparing for the sacraments.
- 4. Observe the marriage laws of the Catholic Church: to give religious training, by example and word, to one's children; to use parish schools and catechetical programs.
- 5. To strengthen and support the Church: one's own parish community and parish priests, the worldwide Church and the Pope.
- 6. To do penance, including abstaining from meat and fasting from food on the appointed days.
- 7. Join in the missionary work of the Church.

PRAYING WITH SCRIPTURE

Christians believe that the Bible is the living word of God. For this word to speak to us, though, we must read and reflect on it. We must hear what the Lord is saying to us through the particular Scripture reading. Meditation uses the mind and the heart to help us hear the word of the Lord. It engages the faculties of thinking and imagination (our minds), the love we have for God (our hearts), and also the resolutions we make to live better Christian lives (our hands and feet).

- 1. SELECT a passage.
- 2. SETTLE DOWN.
- 3. PRAY TO THE HOLY SPIRIT to help you pray and hear what the Lord is saying to you.
- 4. READ the scripture passage SLOWLY AND MEDITATIVELY.
- 5. OBSERVE: Step into the story; become part of it.

- 6. REFLECT: What does the story mean, what strikes you as the main point?
- 7. LISTEN: "What Lord, are you saying to me in this reading?"
- 8. RESOLUTION: Resolve to do something about the insights you have gained.
- THANKSGIVING: Thank the Lord for your time of prayer and the insights you have received.



RITE OF PENANCE

The sacrament of Penance, or Reconciliation, celebrates God's love and forgiveness which reach out to us through the ministry of the Church.

Preparation: I prepare for the sacrament of Penance by looking back over my words and actions since my last confession. How do I fulfill God's command to love my neighbor as myself? Do I try to "get even" when others hurt me? Do I hold grudges? Do I show reverence and respect for my body? Am I sorry for my sins and do I ask God for help with these problems?

Priest's Welcome: The priest, the minister of Reconciliation, greets me in the name of Jesus and of the Church.

Reading from Scripture: The priest may share a Bible reading with me.

Confession: I confess my sins to the priest. I tell him how I have offended God and what I would like to improve in my life. The priest then advises me. He suggests ways in which I might serve God better. The priest then asks me to say a prayer or to do an act of kindness to show that I am sorry and wish to change the direction of my life. This is called my penance.

Prayer of Sorrow: The priest than asks me to tell God I am sorry for my sins. I say a prayer of sorrow, called an act of contrition.

Absolution: Acting in the name of the Christian community, the priest extends his hands and asks God to give me pardon and peace. The priest forgives me in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. This is called absolution. I answer, "Amen."

Prayer of Praise and Dismissal: After absolution, I praise God with the priest. Then the priest says, "The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace." I answer, "Amen."
